Did you know?

In 1884 the Town of Giffords (now Great Kills) had about 54 houses and 250 people. 26 houses on Amboy Road, 9 on Giffords Lane, 5 on Nelson Avenue, 8 on the shore front and 4 on Railroad Place. Giffords was a famous stopping place for fishermen – with three stages running from station to beach on dirt roads.

The railroad ticket agent lived upstairs over the waiting room. Ice cream was bought from the undertaker who drove through twice a week with ice cream cans in the back of his "Roakaway".

The people at Giffords were happy to have a regularly organized church in their community. The work began to prosper as membership and Sunday School grew.

By 1907 it was evident more Sunday School space was needed. Plans were drawn for a new Sunday School annex which included a gymnasium. Since the community would benefit from this new structure a plea was made to the citizens to help raise \$10,000. The church raised \$6,000 and the community \$3,500.

On October 11, 1908 the building was dedicated. The gym included a basketball court with the walls being out of bounds. As a result, there were many bruised and scratched bodies.

All of the above was passed down to me from my great grandfather, the first church mouse!
