When I was in high school I tried to read the Bible beginning to end. I'd gone to Church and Sunday School forever, so the stories were familiar. However, I was confused when the same stories were told in different books. Some stories were similar, but not the same. The sermon on the mount was similar to the sermon on the plain, but not the same. Jesus fed 5000 people and then 4000 people. Did someone overestimate the crowd? The woman who anointed Jesus's feet with perfume, is it the same story in each gospel?

The New Testament relates the story of a eunuch from Ethiopia who was trying to understand the scriptures. Acts 8:26-39 reports that he was reading from Isaiah when the apostle Phillip ran up to his chariot and asked him if he understood what he was reading. The man replied, "How can I unless someone explains it to me."

Reading the Bible can be confusing. Some chapters are too long; some are too short. How do we understand without a teacher? There's help.

The Christian Education Committee invites you to engage in Bible study. Right now we are studying Psalms on Sundays after worship.

Also, consider the Moravian Daily Texts. Each daily lesson takes about ten minutes to read. There's an Old Testament reading, a selection from Psalms, a New Testament reading, a couple of hymns, and a prayer for each day. If you read the Daily Texts, you will cover the entire Old and New Testaments in two years, and the book of Psalms in one year. A further benefit is that the Daily Texts tends to follow the Revised Common Lectionary. That means the Sunday church scriptures and sermon often use the same scriptures found in the Daily Texts. Our relatives and friends who worship at different churches often hear the same scriptures we do, because many churches use the Revised Common Lectionary. After church we can talk about the same scriptures when we're eating together. How cool is that!

Although our congregation has already sent in our order for copies of the Daily Texts, you can still buy one. You just won't get the 10% discount. I buy mine, for example, from Amazon to read on my Kindle. My old eyes need to be able to enlarge the print as I read.

After all, as the eunuch in Acts admitted, we need a guide to help us understand.

SAFE Disposal Events (Solvents, Automotive, Flammables, and Electronics)



Throughout the year in all five boroughs to give residents a location to drop off their harmful household products safely. **Staten Island - Saturday, October 19** 10am—4pm Midland Beach Parking Lot: Father Capodanno Blvd. and Hunter Ave. Cars approach from Slater Blvd. **Who is Eligible** Only New York City residential waste is accepted at SAFE Disposal Events. No commercial vehicles are allowed. Residents must provide proof of NYC residency, such as a NYS

driver's license or utility bill. **What to Bring** Automotive products such as motor oil, transmission fluid, and batteries, personal care items such as unwanted/expired medicines or cosmetics (i.e. Nail polish), Syringes (clearly labeled and packaged in a "sharps" container or other leak-proof, puncture-resistant container), thermometers, household products such as pesticides, paint, hazardous cleaners, compact fluorescent light bulbs, electronics – check the list of items that are considered electronics.
